

FEMA Cooperative Technical Partners (CTP) Community Outreach and Mitigation Strategies (COMS) Grant



18-month grant period (September 2020 – March 2022)

Funding for two positions at OPR:

- Lead on Feasibility Study Beth Hotchkiss

CTP Team includes:

Goal 1: Coordination and development of at least two flood risk mitigation pilot projects that can meet FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) eligibility requirements.

Goal 2: Feasibility study that explores the development and ongoing maintenance of a public-facing easily navigable local government "risk mitigation" project database for the Adaptation Clearinghouse. (Work will start in January 2021)





- OPR, through ICARP, will provide technical assistance and coordination support to align Federal Hazard Mitigation Assistance funding with state programmatic resilience goals.
- Priority project types, as identified by FEMA:
 - Soil health,
 - Urban Greening,
 - Seismic safety for multi-family residences.
